The Family Caregiver Program offers the following services:

SUPPORT GROUPS

Groups provide education and emotional support and assist caregivers in making decisions and solving problems related to their caregiving role.

TEMPORARY RESPITE

Funding provides a substitute caregiver to provide short-term and temporary breaks when the regular caregiver must be away.

SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES

Items to support the needs of caregivers, including adaptive equipment, home modifications, emergency call systems, counseling sessions and legal consultation.

INFORMATION

Public education and outreach such as group presentations to help caregivers learn of existing services and resources in their community.

ASSISTANCE

Telephone consultation, care management and referrals help caregivers gain access to other services.
