

Understanding Advance Care Planning

Definitions

- 1. **Advance Care Planning**: The process to determine your wishes about medical care and treatment including appointing a health care representative.
- 2. **Advance Directives**: A document that provides clear instructions about your future medical care and treatment. May also be called a Living Will.
- 3. **Power of Attorney**: A document that authorizes another person to act on your behalf in specified matters such as financial decisions.
- 4. **Health Care Representative**: The person you appoint to receive healthcare information and make healthcare decisions for you when you are unable.
- 5. **POST** (Physicians Orders for Scope of Treatment): A document that records your end-of- life treatment preferences as a medical order signed by your physician, advance practice nurse, or physician assistant. The POST is for individuals within 12 months of end-of-life.

Making your Wishes Known

- Talk about your health care wishes with your physician and your family
- Appoint a Health Care Representative who can ensure your wishes are carried out if you are no longer able to speak for yourself
- Speak with an Elder Law Attorney or Indiana Legal Aid for assistance
